

How to Prepare Yourself to serve God at CFW

It is important to remember that you are God's ambassador everywhere you go.

Let's take an inventory:

- Do I have a positive mental attitude?
- Am I prayed up with spiritual armor in place?
- Do I have unconfessed sin which may hinder my prayers?
- Am I clothed with humility or is it pride in disguise?
- Do I have a spirit of excellence or perfection?
- Am I dressed for success?
- Do I have plenty of CFW Business Cards in tow?

Find a secure place in your purse to keep some CFW business cards. You know the perfect place where they will be safe from sticky candy and lip color. You know the place where they won't get crumbled and torn. Now you are ready to whip that beautiful CFW card out and share about us with a friend, co-worker or a potential client. Yes! That's right a potential client. Beware though! Not all women who appear to be pregnant are pregnant! (Please ask Rose if you need clarification on this issue). So to be on the safe side, say something like this, "Hi, my name is Betty Bravery and this is where I work.
